**NOTIFICATION**

In exercise of the powers conferred by clauses (i), (j) and (k) of section 33 and sub-section (1) of section 20 of the Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973 (59 of 1973), the Central Council of Homeopathy, with the previous sanction of the Central Government hereby makes the following regulations, namely: -

**PART I**

**Preliminary**

**1. Short title and commencement**

- a. These regulations may be called the Homeopathy (Minimum Standards of Education) Regulations, 1983.
- b. They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Gazette of India.

**2. Definitions**

In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires –

- a. “Act” means the Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973 (59 of 1973);
- b. “Courses” means the Courses of study in Homeopathy, namely: -
  - i. D.H.M.S. (Diploma in Homeopathic Medicine and Surgery) and
  - ii. B.H.M.S. (Bachelor of Homeopathic Medicine and Surgery)
- c. “Diploma” means a Diploma in Homeopathy as defined in clause (iii) of regulation 3 of the Homeopathy (Diploma Course) Regulation, 1983;
- d. “Degree” means a Degree in Homeopathy as defined in clause (iv) of regulation 2 of the Homeopathy (Graded Degree Course) Regulations, 1983 or in clause (iv) of regulation 2 of the Homeopathy (Degree Course) Regulations, 1983
- e. “Homeopathic College” means a Homeopathic Medical College affiliated to a Board or University and recognised by the Central Council
- f. “Inspector” means an Medical Inspector appointed under sub-section (I) of section 17 of the Act;
- g. “President” means the President of the Central Council.
- h. “Second Schedule” and “Third Schedule,” means the Second Schedule and Third Schedule respectively of the Act.
- i. “Syllabus” and “Curriculum” means the Syllabus and Curriculum for different courses of study as specified by the Homeopathy (Diploma Course) Regulations, 1983, the Homeopathy (Graded Degree Course) Regulations, 1983 and the Homeopathy (Degree Course) Regulations, 1983.
- j. “Teaching Experience” means teaching experience in the subject concerned in a Homeopathic College or in a Hospital recognised by the Central Council.
- k. “Visitor” means a Visitor appointed under sub-section (I) of section 18 of the Act.

## **PART II**

### **Staff: Equipment, Training and other Facilities**

#### **3. Minimum Requirements**

There shall be attached to every Homeopathic College a Hospital having not less than 25 beds and every such College shall, within a period of five years from the commencement of these regulations, provide minimum requirements, norms and standards as specified by these regulations in regard to teaching staff, equipment, accommodation, training and other facilities in such College.

#### **4. Power of Central Council to Call for Information and Returns**

The Central Council shall have the power to call for such information and returns as it may deem fit from examining bodies and Homeopathic Colleges shall furnish the said information and returns in triplicate within the time specified by the Central Council.

#### **5. Facilities for Inspectors and Visitors**

Every Homeopathic College shall provide all necessary facilities to the Inspectors and Visitors appointed by the Central Council to discharge their duties and functions.

#### **6. Criteria for Admission of Students**

Admission of students to Homeopathic Colleges imparting instructions for Diploma or Degree Courses shall be in accordance with the student-bed ratio of 2:1 and 1:1 respectively in their attached Hospitals.

#### **7. Minimum Teaching Staff**

The minimum number and category of teaching staff: -

- a. For a Homeopathic College imparting instruction in D.H.M.S. (Diploma in Homeopathic Medicine and Surgery) shall be in accordance with Annexure 'A'
- b. For a Homeopathic College imparting instruction in B.H.M.S. (Graded Degree Course) shall be in accordance with Annexure 'B'.
- c. For a Homeopathic College imparting instruction in B.H.M.S. (Degree Course) shall be in accordance with Annexure 'C'.

#### **8. Teaching Staff**

A Homeopathic College shall appointed in its Departments only full time staff

Provided that were suitably qualified full time teachers are not available a Homeopathic College may employ part-time upto a maximum of thirty per cent of the total strength of its teaching staff

Provided further that the appointment of such part-time teachers shall be restricted to teaching staff above the rank of a lecturer

Provided also that such part-time teachers shall conduct not less than three ours clinical or teaching classes every working day in such College or its attached Hospital.

#### **9. Head of a Homeopathic Colleges**

The head of a Homeopathic College shall be a full-time employee of the said College.

#### **10. Hospital Staff**

The strength of staff in a Hospital attached to a Homeopathic College shall be in accordance with Annexure 'D'.

### **11. Qualification etc. of teaching staff**

The minimum qualifications and age for appointment of teaching staff to the various posts shall be in accordance with Annexure 'E'.

### **12. Experience as practitioner deemed to be equivalent to teaching experience**

In case of appointment of a part-time teacher in a Homeopathic College, the period of experience as a practitioner of Homeopathy shall be considered equivalent to that of teaching experience required for the said appointment.

### **13. Equipment, training and other facilities etc**

The equipment, training and other facilities for education in Homeopathy to be made available to students by every Homeopathic College shall be in accordance with Annexures 'F' and 'G' respectively.

## **PART III**

### **Accommodation**

#### **14. General**

Every Homeopathic College shall be housed in a unitary building and it shall be located near the Hospital attached to it. The College grounds shall have its own land and building for running its various departments. It shall have in addition an attached indoor Hospital with the prescribed number of beds.

The College shall also have a well equipped outpatient department with the following sections, medical, chronic medical, surgical, gynecological and antenatal, ophthalmology, ear, nose and throat and paediatrics. The beds in the said Hospital shall be divided for treating cases on the following basis.

- 60% for acute and chronic medical cases including 10% for paediatrics
- 20% for surgical including ear, nose and throat and ophthalmology; and
- 20% for gynecological and obstetrics cases.

The indoor and out-patient department wings of the College shall be in a running condition

In addition to the accommodation mentioned above the College building shall provide the following:

1. Principal's office room with attached toilet room and retiring room
2. Visitors room
3. Committee room
4. Office room for accommodating at least seven assistants including office superintendent
5. Central store room
6. Staff room with attached toilet facilities
7. Toilet facilities for visitors and office staff
8. Record room
9. Canteen
10. Library with reading room with separate arrangement for staff and students with adequate seating accommodation
11. Separate common rooms for male and female students
12. Five lecture halls each a seating capacity for 50 to 100 students
13. Separate toilet facilities for male and female students

14. College auditorium to accommodate at least 400 to 500 persons.

## **TEACHING DEPARTMENTS**

### **1. Anatomy Department**

#### a. Dissection Hall

It shall be spacious enough to accommodate 50 shall be glazed upto 6 feet from the floor. Adequate provision for ventilation and lighting shall be made. Tanks for preservation of dissected parts and wash basins shall be provided. Preparation room and a cadaver room shall also, if possible, be provided, adjacent to the dissection has together with a departmental storeroom and a small office room attached to the dissection hall with toilet facilities.

#### b. Museum

Accommodation shall be provided for racks and shelves for storing and proper display of wet and dry specimens, models, revolving stands for diagram; trolley tables, with a seating accommodation for about 30 to 50 students at a time.

#### c. Small office room for the staff with toilet facilities.

### **2. Physiology Department**

a. Laboratories: Tables with reagents, shelves, cupboards below, fitted with water tape and sinks on the tabletop with electric and gas points to accommodate 30 to 50 students. Anterooms for storing balance. Facility of distillation apparatus shall be provided. Facility for experimental physiology shall be provided in the Laboratory and a departmental storeroom.

b. Museum with glass cupboards and shelves for display of models and diagrams with a seating capacity of 30 to 50 students

c. Small office room for the staff with toilet facilities.

### **3. Pharmacology Department**

a. Laboratories: Sufficient accommodation shall be provided for laboratory tables with shelves and cupboard fitted with water taps and sinks on the table top with electric and gas points to accommodate 30 to 50 students. Anterooms for storing balance etc.

b. Museum with glass cupboards and shelves for storing and display of specimens with a seating capacity of 30 to 50 students, attached departmental storeroom.

c. Small office room for the staff with toilet facilities

d. A herbarium for medicinal plants shall also be provided.

### **4. Pathology and Bacteriology Department**

a. Laboratories: Tables with reagents, shelves, cupboards fitted with water tapes and sinks on the table top with electric and gas points to accommodate 30 to 50 students, attached store room with high speed centrifuge room.

b. Museum: Sufficient accommodation for show cases and cupboards for at-least 500 specimens with seating facility for 30 to 50 students.

c. Small office room for the staff with toilet facilities.

### **5. Preventive and Social Medicine and Forensic Medicine Departments**

a. Museum: Sufficient accommodation for cupboards and show cases for storing and displaying models illustrating the insanitary and sanitary dwellings, wells, tanks,

vectors of diseases carrying germs, family exhibits with a separate annexe to accommodate museum, for storage and display of medico-legal specimens with seating accommodation for 15 to 25 students

- b. Departmental storeroom
- c. Small office room for the staff with toilet facilities.

#### 6. Rooms for Head of Departments

The anchorage of every department other than those of anatomy, physiology, pharmacology, pathology, preventive and social medicine and jurisprudence shall each be provided with a small office room 8 such rooms.

#### 7. Hospital

Proper accommodation for physicians, surgeons, gynecologist, obstetricians and other visiting staff

Dispensing, linen and other stores, medicine store, preparation room, examination room, labour room, operation theatre, surgical dressing rooms, sterilisation room, superintendent's room, patient's relations shed, patient's waiting hall, enquiry office, accommodation for resident staff, medical officers, nurses, nurses duty room, small room, record room and lavatories for outdoor and indoor patients and kitchen for indoor hospital, laundry etc. with all modern facilities and technical requirements shall be provided.

### PART IV

#### Residential Accommodation

#### 15. Hostels and quarters

Hostels for male and female students separately for accommodating atleast 150 male students and 40 females students with sanitary facilities, mess, common room and games facilities

Family quarters for (i) the Principal, (ii) the Superintendent of the Hospital and, (iii) the teaching staff, (iv) Resident Medical Officer, (v) House Physicians, Surgeons, (vi) Nurses and (vii) employees.

- B. Research experience in Homeopathy in an institution recognised by the Central Council for Research, in Indian Medicine and Homeopathy or the Central Council for Research in Homeopathy or the Central Government or a State Government in a responsible position.

Age

Not more than 50 years as on the last date of receipt of application for the post.  
Age relaxable for an exceptionally qualified person.

## **2. Professor in Homeopathic Subjects**

Essential Qualifications

- A. (i) A recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy

OR

- (ii) A qualification included in the III Schedule of the Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973.

- B. Two years teaching experience as a Reader or Assistant Professor or at least seven years teaching experience

Preferential Qualifications

- A. Having both a recognised diploma or degree in Homeopathy and a qualification included in the III Schedule of the Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973
- B. Administrative experience or Research experience in an institution recognised by Central Council for Research in Indian Medicine and Homeopathy or Central Council for Research in Homeopathy or the Central Government or a State Government in responsible position.

Age

Not more than 45 years as on the last date of receipt of application for the post.  
Age relaxable in the case of an exceptionally qualified person.

## **3. Professor in Allied Medical Subjects**

- A. (i) A recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy

- (ii) A degree recognised by the Medical Council of India preferably with qualification included in the III Schedule of the Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973.

- B. Five years teaching experience in the subject concerned in a Homeopathic or Allopathic Medical College.

Preferential Qualifications

- A. Diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy for those possessing qualifications recognised by the Medical Council of India
- B. Administrative or Research experience in an institution recognised by the Central Council of Homeopathy or Central Council for Research in Indian Medicine and

Homeopathy or Central Council for Research in Homeopathy or the Central Government or a State Government in a responsible position.

Age

Not more than 45 years as on the last date of receipt of application for the post.  
Age relaxable in the case of exceptionally qualified persons.

**4. Reader / Assistant Professor in Homeopathic subjects**

A. (i) A recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy

OR

(ii) A qualification included in the III Schedule of Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973.

B. Three years of teaching experience as a Lecturer or five years of teaching Experience.

Preferential Qualification

A. Having both a recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy and a qualification included in the III Schedule of Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973

B. Administrative or Research experience in an institution recognised by the Central Council of Homeopathy or Central Council for Research in Indian Medicine and Homeopathy or Central Council for Research in Homeopathy or the Central Government or a State Government in a responsible position.

**5. Reader / Assistant Professor in Allied Medical Subjects**

Essential Qualification

A. (i) A recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy

OR

(ii) A degree recognised by the Medical Council of India

B. Three years of teaching experience as a lecturer or five years of teaching experience in a recognised Allopathic or Homeopathic Medical College.

Preferential Qualification

A. Having both a recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy for those possessing qualifications recognised by the Medical Council of India.

B. Administrative or Research experience in an institution recognised by the Central Council of Homeopathy or Central Council for Research in Indian Medicine and Homeopathy or Central Council for Research in Homeopathy or the Central Government or a State Government in a responsible position.

Age

Not more than 40 years as on the last date of receipt of application for the post.  
Age relaxable in the case of an exceptionally qualified person.

**6. Lecturer in Homeopathic Subjects**

Essential Qualifications

- A. (i) A recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy

OR

- (ii) A qualification included in the III Schedule of the Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973

- B. Two years teaching experiences in a recognised Homeopathic College.

Preferential Qualifications

Having both a recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy and a qualification included in III Schedule of the Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973

Age

Not more than 35 years as on the last date of receipt of application for the post. Age relaxable in the case of an exceptionally qualified person.

**7. Lecturer in Allied Medical Subjects**

Essential Qualification

- A. (i) A recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy

OR

- (ii) A degree recognised by the Medical Council of India

- B. Two years teaching experience in a recognised Allopathic or Homeopathic College and Hospital.

Preferential Qualification

- A. Recognised diploma after 4 years study of a degree in Homeopathy for those possessing qualifications recognised by the Medical Council of India  
B. Qualification included in the III Schedule of Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973.

OR

M.D. or M.S. or an allopathic post-graduate diploma qualification.

Age

Not more than 35 years on the last date of receipt of application for the post. Age relaxable for an exceptionally qualified person.

**8. Demonstrators (in all subjects)**

Essential Qualifications

- A. (i) A recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy

OR

- (ii) A degree in modern medicine

Preferential Qualifications

- A. Having both a recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy and qualification included in the III Schedule of the Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973

OR

- M.D. or M.S. or an allopathic post-graduate diploma in the subject concerned
- B. Experience of working at any government Homeopathic Dispensary or at any Homeopathic or Allopathic College and Hospital

Age

Must be between 22 years to 30 years on the last date of receipt of application.  
Age relaxable in the case of an exceptionally qualified and experienced person.

## II DEGREE COURSE

### 1. Principal

Essential Qualification

- A. (i) A recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy

OR

- (ii) Qualification included in the III Schedule of the Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973.
- B. Ten years teaching experience with 5 years administrative experience in recognised Homeopathic College or Hospital

Preferential Qualifications

- A. Having both a recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy and any qualification included in the III Schedule of the Homeopathy Central Council Act.
- B. Research experience in Homeopathy in an institution recognised by Central Council for Research in Indian Medicine and Homeopathy or Central Council for Research in Homeopathy of the Central Government or a State Government.

### 2. Professor in Homeopathy Subjects

Essential Qualifications

- A. (i) A recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy

OR

- (ii) A qualification included in the III Schedule of the Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973.
- B. Three years of teaching experience as Reader or Asst. Professor or ten years teaching experience.

Preferential Qualification

- A. Having both a recognised diploma or a degree in Homeopathy and the qualification included in the III Schedule of Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973.
- B. Administrative experience or Research experience in an institution or unit recognised by the Central Council of Homeopathy or Central Council for Research in Indian Medicine and Homeopathy or Central Council for Research in Homeopathy or Central Government or a State Government in a responsible position.

Age

Not more than 45 years as on the date of receipt of application for the post. Age relaxable in the case of an exceptionally qualified person.

### **3. Professors in Allied Medical Subjects**

Essential Qualifications

- A. (i) A recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy

OR

- (ii) A degree recognised by the Medical Council of India preferably with qualifications included in the III Schedule of the Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973.

- B. Three years teaching experience as Reader or Asst. Professor or ten years teaching experience in the subject concerned in Homeopathic or Allopathic Medical College.

Preferential Qualification

- A. Any qualification in Homeopathy as per Second and Third Schedules for those possessing qualifications recognised by the Medical Council of India.
- B. Administrative or Research experience in an Institution recognised by Central Council of Homeopathy or Central Council of Research in Indian Medicine and Homeopathy or Central Council for Research in Homeopathy or Central Government or a State Government in a responsible position.

Age

Not more than 45 years as on the last date of receipt of application for the post. Age relaxable in the case of an exceptionally qualified person.

### **4. Reader / Asst. Professor in Homeopathic Subjects**

Essential Qualifications

- A. (i) A recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy

OR

- (ii) A qualification included in the III Schedule of the Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973.

- B. Four years of teaching experience as Lecturer or seven years of teaching experience.

Preferential Qualifications

- A. Having both a recognised diploma or a degree in Homeopathy and the qualification included in the III Schedule of the Homeopathy Central Council Act, 1973.
- B. Administrative experience or Research experience in an Institution recognised by Central Council of Homeopathy or Central Council for Research in Indian Medical and Homeopathy or Central Council for Research in Homeopathy or Central Government or a State Government in a responsible position

Age

Not more than 40 years on the last date of receipt of application for the post. Age relaxable in the case of an exceptionally qualified person.

- B. Four years of teaching experience as a lecturer or seven years of teaching experience in a recognised Allopathic or Homeopathic Medical College.

Preferential Qualifications

- A. A qualification in Homeopathy included in the second and third Schedules for those possessing allopathic qualifications.
- B. Administrative or Research experience in an Institution recognised by the Central Council of Indian Medicine and Homeopathy or Central Council for Research in Homeopathy or Central Government or a State Government in a responsible position.

Age

Not more than 40 years as on the last date of receipt of application for the post. Age relaxable in case of an exceptionally qualified person.

#### **6. Lecturer in Homeopathic subjects**

Essential Qualifications

- A. (i) A recognised diploma after 4 years study or a degree in Homeopathy

OR

**ANNEXURE G**  
(Regulation 13)

**Training and other Facilities for education**

Besides the facilities referred to in the foregoing regulations, every homeopathic college shall also provide other facilities such as a well equipped library, a museum with an adequate number of specimens, charts of important plant and substances used as drugs, a herbarium, audio-visual equipment, an Epidiascope and a projector, photos and bio-data of eminent Homeopaths.
